MINUTES March 5, 2013

The Capital Budget Overview Committee met on Tuesday, March 5, 2013 at 3:00 p.m. in Room 201 of the Legislative Office Building.

The following members were in attendance:

Representative Campbell called the meeting to order at 3:05 p.m.

ACCEPTANCE OF MINUTES:

On a motion by Representative Graham, seconded by Senator Boutin, that the minutes of the January 9, 2013 meeting be accepted as written. MOTION ADOPTED.

NEW BUSINESS:

RSA 9:26-a, PROHIBITED CHANGES:

<u>CAP 13-014 Department of Health and Human Services</u> – Christine Bean, Director, and Sally Hartman, Program Manager, Public Health Laboratories, Department of Health and Human Services, presented the request and responded to questions of the Committee. Michael Kane, Deputy Legislative Budget Assistant, Office of Legislative Budget Assistant, was present to speak to the provisions of RSA 9:16-a, Prohibited Changes.

On a motion by Senator Boutin, seconded by Representative Cloutier, that the Committee approve the request of the Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Public Health Services, to spend an estimated total amount not to exceed \$36,556.73 in unused funds appropriated for Lab Improvement be used for the following additional Laboratory improvements: 1) Remove the rug and seal the floor with industrial grade non-permeable paint in Room B29, 29 Hazen Drive, Concord, NH, at an estimated \$3,000, 2) Install a fume hood in room B29 for the preparation and analysis of radioactive ("hot") samples, at an estimated \$32,235, and 3) Install a sliding glass window between Room B29 and B30 (emergency sample receipt room) on the existing window so that the samples from the outside are moved smoothly into Room B29, at an estimated \$500, as specified in the request dated January 9, 2013. On a motion by Senator Boutin, and seconded by Senator Stiles, that the Committee **approve item #2 only** of the request of The Adjutant General's Department to use the remaining Armory Statewide Auxiliary Power, Chapter 264, Laws of 2007, balance of \$609,243.85 to extend the generator installation and associated electrical upgrade beyond the main distribution panels so that all electrical distribution/life safety systems will be optimized in the event of a state emergency, as specified in the request dated January 31, 2013. MOTION ADOPTED.

On a motion by Representative Cloutier, seconded by Senator Boutin, that the Committee table item #1 of the request of The Adjutant General's Department to use the remaining D&E Storage Buildings – Additional Power and Lighting, Chapter 145, Laws of 2009, balance of \$151,651.24 towards replacing all existing electrical systems to meet current code at additional Readiness Centers throughout the state. MOTION ADOPTED. The Committee requested that the Department go through the Legislative process to modify the original Capital Budget request.

The Adjutant General's Department has two Capital appropriations with substantially completed projects, and requests committee approval, in accordance with RSA 9:26-a, that the remaining funds be used for our aging Readiness Centers (armories) as follows:

Project Name: D&E Storage Buildings - Additional Power and Lighting

Chapter 145, Laws of 2009 (Lapse Dates Extended)

Original Appropriation: \$282,000.00 Remaining Balance: \$151,651.24

Buildings #D and #E are both located at the State Military Reservation in Concord, New Hampshire and provide much needed storage space for military unit equipment. The required work, as intended in our original budget request, consisting of replacing all existing electrical systems to meet current code, has been completed. We respectfully request to replicate this effort from the remaining balance in this appropriation at additional Readiness Centers throughout the state.

Project Name: Armory Statewide Auxiliary Power

Chapter 264, Laws of 2007

Original Appropriation: \$1,500,000.00 Remaining Balance: \$609,243.85

The purchase and installation of generators at our Readiness Centers (statewide) is substantially complete. As a result of the purchase and installation of these generators, and the necessary work involved with this project, most of the main electrical distribution panels were subsequently replaced in order to meet current National Electrical Code (NEC). However, the electrical distribution/life safety systems beyond the main distribution panels inside our Readiness Centers were not updated. In order for the generators to become fully operational, additional work is required within the electrical distribution/life safety systems so that lights, outlets, fire alarms and other vital communications systems will work during a state emergency. We respectfully request to extend the generator installation and associated electrical npgrade beyond the main distribution panel so that all electrical distribution/life safety systems will be optimized in the event of a state emergency.

Summary:

The average age of a New Hampshire Readiness Center is over 50 years old. While The Adjutant General's Department has been fortunate to receive continued support through HB 25 in support of our Capital improvements, we have received little growth in the general funds available for the sustainment of these Readiness Centers. We feel that the realignment of these Capital appropriations is sound fiscal stewardship, which eventually saves the state money. The key benefit of investing in our facilities will allow us the ability to sustain our Federal mission, as well as our ability to support the State's needs within our communities in which we live and serve.

Requested Action

In accordance with RSA 9:26 -a the Department of Health and Human Services requests unused funds appropriated for Fire Protection Sprinklers be used for the following additional Fire Protection purpose, at a sum not to exceed \$42,000:

 Install fire protection sprinklers within the NHH Greenhouse attached to the Acute Psychiatric Services building where there has not been protection installed previously per recommendation of the State Fire Marshall explained below.

Explanation

In 2011 the Legislature approved this Capital Budget requests per Chapter 253:1:VII-A. The amount of \$1,125,000.00 was approved to replace sprinkler systems, which had developed many leaks since installed in the late 1980's. After hidding the work, applying anticipated charges for a clerk of the works and an analysis of the current progress and costs, NHH projects an anticipated budget surplus of \$42,000.

We request that the surplus funds be applied to adding new sprinklers in the Greenhouse portion of APS, which had never been required to have an operational sprinkler system, at a sum not to exceed \$42,000.

Apparently the interpretation of fire and safety codes in the 1980's, and the fact that the construction materials of the Greenhouse were non-combustible, did not require sprinklers originally. Current interpretation by the State Fire Marshall is that sprinklers are required.

Dear Chairman Campbell and Honorable Members of the Committee:

Requested Action

Pursuant to the Provisions of RSA Chapter 228: 12-a, Use of Toll Credits, the NH Department of Transportation (NHDOT), on behalf of State Senator Sylvia Larsen and State Senator David Boutin, request the Capital Budget Overview Committee approves the Manchester Transit Authority (MTA)'s use of Toll Credits to meet funding match requirements to operate a bus transit service between the City of Concord and the City of Manchester. As the total project costs are \$160,000 in federal funds requiring a 50% match, the use of \$80,000 in Toll Credit match is requested.

Explanation

The MTA is proposing to operate a bus transit service between Concord and Manchester with stops between Stickney Avenue in Concord, Veteran's Park in Downtown Manchester, and the Manchester-Boston Regional Airport. Under Federal regulations, MTA is eligible to use Toll Credits for this funding match requirement as long as the necessary State approval requirements are met. The MTA proposal is a short-term measure to operate the service for a one-year duration.

The Southern New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission and the Central New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission, in partnership with NHDOT, will be conducting a corridor feasibility study concurrently with this short-term service to determine the long-term bus transit needs of this corridor and identify the appropriate transportation solution to meet those long-term needs.

Please see the attached letter from Senators Larsen and Boutin requesting this use of Toll Credits.

For these reasons, your approval of this resolution is respectfully requested.

Dear Commissioner Clement:

We are writing to ask that you request and the Capital Budget Overview Committee approve the Manchester Transit Authority (MTA)'s use of Toll Credits to meet funding match requirements to operate a bus transit service between the City of Concord and the City of Manchester, including the Manchester-Boston Regional Airport.

We understand that the State has a compelling interest in using Toll Credits judiciously and sparingly. Toll Credits are a valuable strategic economic resource for the State and have been heavily used by the NH Department of Transportation (NHDOT) as the match to the State's federal apportionment for highway and transit programmatic funding in recent years. Failure to preserve sufficient Toll Credits could severely limit New Hampshire's ability to use federal transportation funding and ultimately to invest in the State's infrastructure and transportation network.

Even though the MTA's proposed Concord-Manchester Bus Service is not a NHDOT-sponsored service at this time, we believe that using Toll Credits to support this proposal for an initial trial service is beneficial and justified for the following three reasons:

- 1. The Use of Toll Credits Shall be Limited to a Specific Duration of Time This request is for a short-term service that leverages other federal funds to meet an identified transportation need while providing the time to evaluate a long-term service. The \$160,000 in federal funds will provide funding to operate the service for one year. During this same time, Southern New Hampshire Planning Commission and Central New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission, in cooperation with NHDOT, will be conducting a Concord-Manchester Transit Service Feasibility Study to determine the long-term feasibility of a service in this corridor that will produce enough ridership to justify subsidizing the service with public funding. The short-term service will provide valuable data and qualitative feedback to inform the study.
- 2. The Service Demonstrates a Regional Impact The proposed service would operate between Stickney Avenue in Concord, the bus stop next to Veteran's Park in Downtown

Manchester, and the Manchester-Boston Regional Airport, greatly enhancing the connectivity between New Hampshire's largest and third-largest cities/economies and the State's largest airport while offering a connection point at Stickney Avenue to the population north of Concord. The potential economic benefits would not only be felt in Concord and Manchester — which together contain more than 10% of the State's population — but the service also increases connectivity to the residents and businesses throughout the Lakes Region and into the North Country. Finally, increasing ground transportation and transit options to and from the Manchester Airport has the potential to create a boost in the airport's passenger counts and to enhance New Hampshire's business location and retention. Thus, it has an impact over a broad region of the State and could benefit a large percentage of the State's population.

3. Multimodal Opportunities – Transportation policy at the federal level has been increasingly focused on recognizing that there are different forms of transportation that meet different areas and needs and providing more transportation options with greater multimodal links creates transportation networks that are more efficient and effective. This proposal expands connectivity points and the overall transportation network between a major transportation hub at the airport and other bus networks.

We ask that you submit the formal request to the Capital Budget Overview Committee for the use of Toll Credits to meet funding match requirements for this valuable, temporary service that can benefit so many of our citizens and businesses and can advance our goal of increasing connectivity in our transportation network.

Manchester-Boston Regional Airport (the airport) believes that the best strategy for meeting the region's transportation challenges is a multi-modal approach utilizing foot/bike paths, roads, rail, waterways and airways to successfully meet the needs of all our citizens. Increasing access through connectivity, convenience and cost-effective initiatives provides broad, long-term benefits for everyone.

The airport strongly supports the development of regularly scheduled public ground transit service between the City of Concord, the City of Manchester and the airport. This new regularly scheduled service would provide air travelers from the Concord area with better access to the airport and would also offer arriving passengers increased connectivity to the Capital Region.

Our enplaning passenger surveys reveal that the City of Concord is the fourth highest ranking origin city of New Hampshire air travelers utilizing the airport. Individuals without a personal vehicle and families sharing one vehicle have limited options for getting to/from the airport. Unfortunately too often, air travelers from the Concord area use Boston Logan International Airport instead of their local airport because of the lack of public ground transit options.

A successful public ground transit program is good for the environment. Reducing the number of personal vehicles on the State's roadways helps to reduce the release harmful pollutants including carbon dioxide and nitrous oxide, and also helps to reduce noise impacts with less vehicular traffic frequency.

Manchester-Boston Regional Airport looks forward to working with our federal, state and local transportation partners to improve public ground transit access between the City of Concord, the City of Manchester and the airport.

On behalf of the nearly 1,000 members businesses of the Greater Manchester Chamber of Commerce, please accept this letter in support of increased bus service between Concord and downtown Manchester and Manchester-Boston Regional Airport.

Increased bus service between the state's capital and largest city and airport would produce a number of benefits. In addition to providing greater access for business travelers and others without access to, or the desire to drive, personal vehicles, increased bus service between the two cities and the airport lead to environmental benefits by reducing traffic and improving air quality.

With regard to Manchester-Boston Regional Airport, increasing bus service from Concord will assist air travelers from Concord – the fourth ranking origin city of New Hampshire air travelers using the airport. At a time when the State of New Hampshire is subsidizing bus service to Logan Airport in Boston, it seems more than fair to also provide bus service to New Hampshire's own Manchester-Boston Regional Airport – one of the state's largest economic engines.

At present, Manchester Transit Authority (MTA) does operate public fixed route service between the Concord and Manchester, as well as to Manchester-Boston Regional Airport. While a more permanent solution in devised, perhaps increasing the MTA's level and frequency of this service would be a relatively simple stopgap measure. In addition, MTA has existing system connectivity with Concord Area Transit allowing for easy transfers between both systems.

MTA Concord-MHT Express Bus Service

Service description and budget

The Manchester Transit Authority (MTA) proposes to operate twelve (12) daily trips, Monday-Friday, between the Manchester Boston Regional Airport (MHT) and Concord with seven (7) of the trips passing through Veterans Park in Downtown Manchester and five (5) operating non-stop between MHT and Concord. The service expansion represents ten (10) new Express bus trips in addition to the two (2) trips MTA currently operates. Passengers will require an MTA day pass, currently available on the bus for \$4.00. Additionally, passengers 65 years of age or older as well as those with a valid Medicare or MTA Half Fare ID card will be able to purchase day passes for \$2.00 consistent with Federal Transit Administration guidelines.

In recognition of added parking, administrative, and maintenance costs for Concord Coachlines, MTA will pay an access fee of \$1.00 for each trip for which the day pass was purchased in Concord. The access fee will be paid to Concord Coachlines directly and will not be assessed for trips for which the day pass was purchased in Manchester as those passengers are not parking or consuming services at the Stickney Avenue Park and Ride.

MTA has discussed the proposed schedule with MHT and they are comfortable that this will meet the needs of air travelers wishing to fly in and out of Manchester.

The ten additional trips will run for one (1) year, commencing on July 1, 2013 and ending on June 30, 2014. This represents MTA's fiscal year 2014 (FY14). This is intended to serve as an interim, short term solution while a Corridor Study is completed to assess best strategies for long term connections with MHT.

The total cost of one year of service is \$192,000. MTA currently operates two (2) daily trips at an annual cost of \$32,000 for which sufficient funding is available in FY14. The funding needed for the ten (10) new trips that comprise the service expansion identified for the project is \$160,000. MTA proposes to use FTA Section 5307 funds available to MTA in the amount of \$160,000 which would be matched by \$80,000 in toll credits provided by the State of NH.

Budget Detail

In the interest of clarity, I will provide budget detail based on the \$160,000 needed for the ten additional trips since the current two trips are already fully funded.

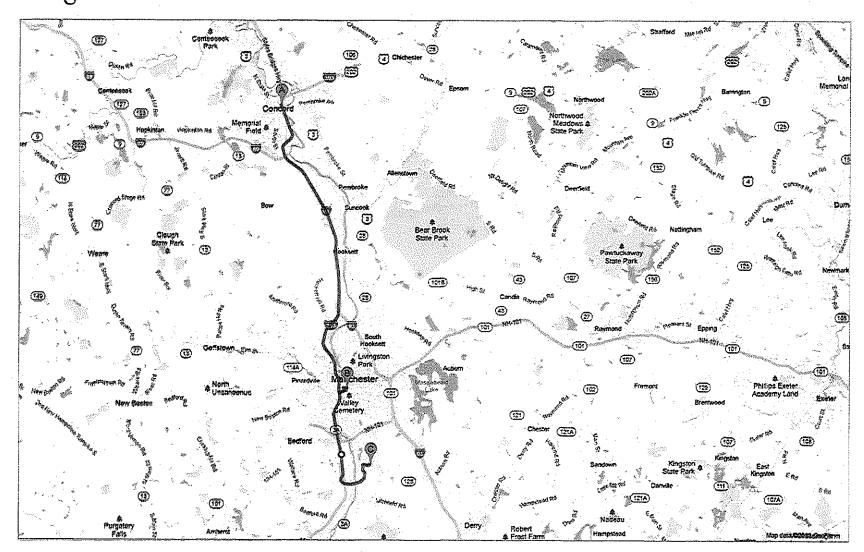
Service provided on 10 trips per day, 5 days per week, 52 weeks per year = 2,600 trips.

Each trip comprises 1.25 revenue hours and 52.6 revenue miles. A revenue hour and mile are reflective of the period the bus is in service, actively picking up and dropping off passengers. Multiplying these figures by 2,600 annual trips yields 3,250 revenue hours and 136,760 revenue miles.

Fleet Purchasing Process

Chapter 223 Laws of 2011, 04-96-96-960515-30050000-030, footnote requires the Department to develop an Equipment Acquisition Plan and receive approval from both the Capital Budget Overview Committee and the Governor and Council before purchasing any new or replacement equipment. This Chapter also requires NHDOT, Bureau of Mechanical Services to submit a monthly status report of the plan to the Capital Budget Overview Committee and the Governor and Council. This document serves as the March 2013, Status Report.

The Department purchases replacement equipment and vehicles in five distinct and separate phases throughout a given fiscal year:

Phase I - Approval Process: The Department reviews the fleet to prioritize replacement needs considering equipment condition, age, and usage. Based on the needs identified and the available budget, the Department identifies the pieces to be replaced and prepares the Equipment Acquisition Plan. The Department then submits the plan to the Capital Budget Overview Committee and the Governor and Council for approval prior to expending Class 30 – Equipment New/Replacement funding as appropriated.

Phase II - Bid & Award: Once the Acquisition Plan is approved the Department works with Administrative Services to prepare a bid package that includes equipment and vehicle specifications and options. When the documents are complete Administrative Services advertises and receives bids, determines the low bidder and executes a notice of contract.

Phase III - Financial Evaluation: The Department compares the contract costs to the estimated costs. Minor quantity adjustments may be made to adjust for actual vs. estimated costs, equipment failure or other factors.

Phase IV – Purchasing: Purchasing is initiated based on the financial evaluation. Priority is given to purchasing the major units and equipment. Remaining funds may be used to purchase necessary miscellaneous shop equipment.

Phase V - Reporting: The Department submits this monthly status report to both the Capital Budget Overview Committee and the Governor and Council. The Attachment to this report shows items to be purchased, planned quantity, planned cost and the planned total that were

shown and approved in the Equipment Acquisition Plan. The attachment also shows the actual purchased quantity, the actual bid price, the actual total cost and the date purchased.

INFORMATIONAL ITEM

The legislature approved \$300,000 in the FY 2012-2013 capital budget (2011, 253:1, II, B5) to repair roofs at the Lakes Region Facility Campus. The future of the campus is unknown and at one of our joint meetings with the House and Senate Public Works Committee members last year, members expressed concerns regarding any expenditure for roof repairs at the Lakes Region Campus.

Approximately 3,158 square feet of roofing at the Powell building needs to be replaced in order to protect the integrity of the structure. The Powell building was occupied by the Department of Corrections prior to their departure in June of 2009. There are two sections of the roof structure that are leaking beyond normal repair and in jeopardy of collapse. Attached is a sketch illustrating the areas of concern and the cost estimate of \$100,000 to complete the work.

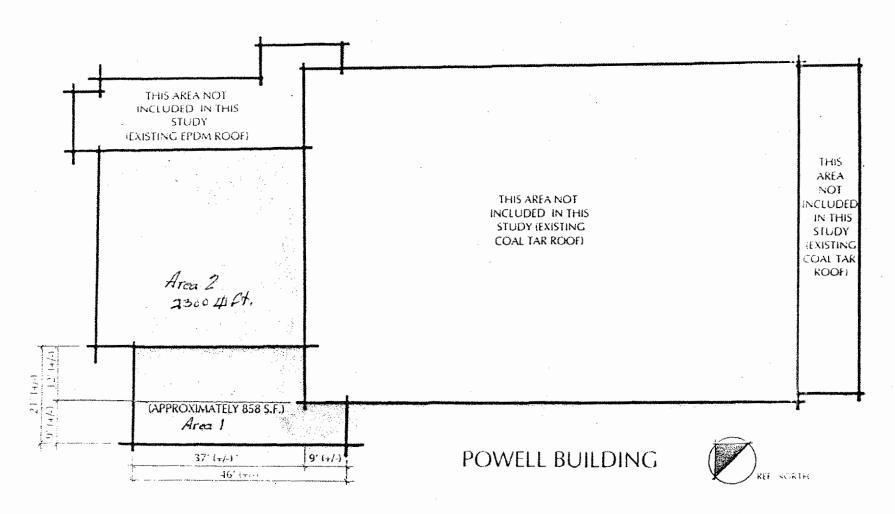

We are a bi-partisan coalition of New Hampshire state representatives who represent the towns of Hampton, North Hampton, Newcastle, Rye, Greenland and Portsmouth. We are writing to you to indicate our strong support for state acquisition of the Hampton Branch segment of the former Boston & Maine Eastern Line railroad right-of-way, extending from Hampton Center to Portsmouth. We support the NHDOT's initiative to pursue acquisition of the newly abandoned section of the corridor when it is offered for sale and we endorse their intent to utilize CMAQ program funds to support the acquisition.

Use of these funds was approved by the CMAQ Committee at its March 29 meeting. The next step in the approval process is to obtain Capital Budget Overview Committee approval to utilize Turnpike Toll Credits in the amount of \$1,000,000 to match the CMAQ approved funds.
