

1 Committee of Conference Report on HB 25-FN-A, an act making appropriations for capital

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1 4 Expenditures; General. The appropriations made for the purpose mentioned in sections 1 and
2 2 of this act, with the exception of appropriations in paragraph III of section 1, and the sums
3 available for those projects, shall be expended by the trustees, commissions, commissioner, or
4 department head of the institutions and departments referred to herein; provided that all contracts
5 and projects and plans and specifications therefor shall be awarded in accordance with the provisions
6 of RSA 21-I and RSA 228.

7 5 Expenditures; Community College System of New Hampshire.

8 I. The appropriations made for the community college system in paragraph III of section 1
9 and the sums available for these projects shall be expended by the trustees of the community college
10 system of New Hampshire.

11 II. The appropriations made to the community college system in paragraph III of section 1
12 are available for all costs incidental to the completion of the projects enumerated including but not
13 limited to the costs of the services for architects, engineers, and other consultants of such kind and
14 capacity as the community college system board of trustees may, in its discretion, wish to employ on
15 such terms and conditions as the board determines. These monies shall be spent under the direction
16 of the community college system board of trustees and pursuant to policies adopted by the board of
17 trustees.

18 III. Any authorization contained in this act which is at variance with the requirements of
19 applicable federal law and regulations shall be controlled by the terms of federal law and
20 regulations.

21 6 Expenditures; University System of New Hampshire.

22 I. The appropriations made for the university system in section 3 and the sums available for
23 these projects shall be expended by the trustees of the university system of New Hampshire. All
24 contracts for the construction of all or any part of said building or facilities shall be let only after
25 competitive sealed bids have been received and only after an advertisement calling for such bids has
26 been published at least once in each 2 consecutive calendar weeks in a newspaper of general
27 circulation in New Hampshire or in a trade journal known to be circulated among the contractors
28 from whom bids will be sought with the state of New Hampshire or elsewhere in the area. The first
29 publication of such advertisement shall be not less than 30 days prior to the date the bids will be
30 received. All conditions considered, wherever possible, it is recommended that the services of New
31 Hampshire architectural and construction firms be considered within the discretion of the trustees.

32 II. The appropriations made to the university system in section 3 are available for all costs
33 incidental to the completion of the projects enumerated including the costs of the services or
34 architects, engineers, and other consultants of such kind and capacity as the university system board
35 of trustees may, in its discretion, wish to employ on such terms and conditions as the board
36 determines. These moneys shall be spent under the direction of the university system board of
37 trustees.

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1 III. If, in the judgment of the trustees of the university system, just cause exists indicating
2 the lowest bid should be rejected, then the contract may be awarded to the next lowest bidder, or, if
3 the next lowest bid should be rejected, the contract may be awarded to the third lowest bidder.

4 IV. The board of trustees of the university system has the right to reject any and all bids
5 and, if the lowest bid is in excess of the appropriation, the board has the right to negotiate with the
6 low bidder or with the 3 lowest bidders for a contract for the construction upon terms considered
7 most advantageous to the university. If only one bid is received, the board of trustees may negotiate
8 a contract for the construction on terms considered most advantageous to the university system and
9 to the state. Any authorization contained in this act which is at variance with the requirements of
10 applicable federal law and regulations shall be controlled by the terms of the federal law and
11 regulations.

12 7 Land Acquisition. Any land acquired under the appropriations made in section 1 and 2 of this
13 act, if any, as may be acquired under the appropriation shall be purchased by the commissioner of
14 the department of administrative services or the commissioner of the department of transportation
15 with the approval of governor and council.

16 8 Bond Authorized. To provide funds for the total of the appropriations of state funds made in
17 sections 1-3 of this act, the state treasurer is hereby authorized to borrow upon the credit of the state
18 not exceeding the sum of \$153,162,568 and for said purposes may issue bonds and notes in the
19 names and on behalf of the state of New Hampshire in accordance with the provisions of RSA 6-A.
20 The source of funds are as follows: general fund \$125,858,414, highway funds \$18,576,904, and
21 other funds \$8,727,250.

22 9 Payments.

23 I. The payment of principal and interest on bonds and notes issued for the projects in
24 sections 1 and 3 shall be made when due from the general fund of the state.

25 II. The payment of principal and interest on bonds issued for the projects in section 2 of this
26 act shall be made from the highway fund.

27 10 Powers of Governor and Council. The governor and council are hereby authorized and
28 empowered:

29 I. To cooperate with and enter into such agreements with the federal government, or any
30 agency thereof, as they may deem advisable, to secure federal funds for the purposes hereof.

31 II. To accept any federal funds which are, or become available for any project under sections
32 1 and 2 beyond the estimated amounts. The net appropriation of state funds for any project for
33 which such additional federal funds are accepted shall be reduced by the amount of such additional
34 funds, and the amount of bonding authorized by section 8 shall be reduced by the same amount.

35 11 Transfers. The individual project appropriations provided in sections 1 and 2 of this act shall
36 not be transferred or expended for any other purposes; provided that if there is a balance remaining
37 after an individual project, which is fully funded by state funds, is completed, accepted, and final

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1 payment made, said balance or any part thereof may be transferred by governor and council, to any
2 other individual project or projects, which are also fully funded by state funds, within the same
3 section and from the same funding source, provided that prior approval of the capital budget
4 overview committee is obtained.

5 12 Reduction of Appropriation and Bonding Authority. If the net appropriation of state funds
6 for any project provided for by sections 1 and 2 is determined on the basis of an estimate of
7 anticipated federal, local, or other funds, and if the amount of such funds actually received or
8 available is less than said estimate, then the total authorized cost for such projects and the net
9 appropriation of state funds thereof shall be reduced by the same proportion as the proportion by
10 which federal, local, or other funds are reduced. The amount of bonding authorized by section 7 shall
11 be reduced by the amount that the appropriation of state funds is reduced pursuant to this section.

12 13 Bureau of Public Works Design and Construction Inspection Services; Davis-Bacon Act
13 Compliance. The appropriations for those projects which are managed by the bureau of public works
14 design and construction, department of administrative services, may be expended to fund temporary
15 personnel for the purpose of providing construction inspection services and Davis-Bacon Act
16 Compliance services for projects utilizing federal funds, for those projects included in this act.

25 * The project in subparagraph IV, A ~~shall~~ **may** utilize the construction management method of
26 contracting. The design for the project shall be submitted [~~no later than April 1, 2014~~] to the capital
27 budget overview committee for approval and shall include sufficient acreage for possible expansion to
28 350 beds for future needs. The primary location for the siting of the facility shall be in Concord on
29 state lands adjacent to the men's prison. If an alternative location is deemed necessary, the siting
30 for the facility shall be subject to prior approval of the capital budget overview committee. The
31 department shall report quarterly to the capital budget overview committee on the status of the
32 project.

4 I. The sum of \$600,000 from the unencumbered balances of the appropriations made to the
5 department of administrative services in 2011, 253:1, II, B, 1, extended by 2013, 195:47, 7 for Hugh
6 Gallen OPS-FACP replacement; in 2013, 195:1, II, B, 1 for records and archives new roof; and in
7 2011, 253:1, II, D, 2, extended by 2013, 195:47, 16 for statewide energy efficiency improvements,
8 shall lapse on June 30, 2015.

9 II. The sum of \$600,000 is hereby appropriated for the biennium ending June 30, 2015 to the
10 department of administrative services for the purchase of 2.7 acres of land currently owned by the
11 department of transportation in the town of Hampton, New Hampshire. Said land shall be used for
12 the construction of a new Hampton District Court. Said funds shall not lapse until June 30, 2017.

13 III. To provide funds for the appropriation made in paragraph II, the state treasurer is
14 hereby authorized to borrow upon the credit of the state not exceeding the sum of \$600,000 and for
15 said purpose may issue bonds and notes in the name of and on behalf of the state of New Hampshire
16 in accordance with RSA 6-A. Payments of principal and interest on the bonds and notes shall be
17 made from the general fund of the state.

18 IV. All contracts and projects and plans and specifications therefor for the projects
19 authorized in this section shall be awarded in accordance with the provisions of RSA 21-I.

20 19 Lapse of Prior Capital Balance; Capital Appropriation; Department of Corrections;
21 Transitional Housing Units.

22 I. The sum of \$250,000 from the unencumbered balance of the appropriation made to the
23 department of administrative services in 2009, 145:1, II, A, 1 extended by 2011, 253:28, 12 and 2013,
24 195:47, 21 for Hillsborough county north asbestos abatement, shall lapse on June 30, 2015.

25 II. The sum of \$250,000 is hereby appropriated for the biennium ending June 30, 2015 to the
26 department of corrections for repairs and renovations to the Calumet transitional housing unit in
27 Manchester and the North End and Shea Farm transitional housing units in Concord. Such funds
28 shall not lapse until June 30, 2017.

29 III. To provide funds for the appropriation made in paragraph II, the state treasurer is
30 hereby authorized to borrow upon the credit of the state not exceeding the sum of \$250,000 and for
31 said purpose may issue bonds and notes in the name of and on behalf of the state of New Hampshire
32 in accordance with RSA 6-A. Payments of principal and interest on the bonds and notes shall be
33 made from the general fund of the state.

34 IV. All contracts and projects and plans and specifications therefor for the projects
