The appropriations made for the purposes mentioned in sections 1 6 and 2 of this act, with the exception of appropriations in paragraph XV of section 1, and the sums $\mathbf{7}$ available for those projects, shall be expended by the trustees, commissions, commissioner, or 8 department head of the institutions and departments referred to herein; provided that all contracts 9 and projects and plans and specifications therefor shall be awarded in accordance with the 10 provisions of RSA 21-I and RSA 228.

11 4 Land Acquisition. Any land acquired under the appropriations made in sections 1 and 2 of 12this act, if any, as may be acquired under the appropriation shall be purchased by the commissioner 13of the department of administrative services or the commissioner of the department of 14transportation with the approval of governor and council.

155 Bond Authorized. To provide funds for the total of the appropriations of state funds made in 16sections 1 and 2 of this act, the state treasurer is hereby authorized to borrow upon the credit of the state not exceeding the sum of \$ 322,972,089 and for said purposes may issue bonds and notes in the 1718names and on behalf of the state of New Hampshire in accordance with the provisions of RSA 6-A. 19The source of funds are as follows: general fund \$109,788,718, highway fund \$14,845,000, and other 20funds \$16,288,000.

216 Payments.

22I. The payment of principal and interest on bonds and notes issued for the projects in section 231 of this act shall be made when due from the general fund of the state.

24II. The payment of principal and interest on bonds issued for the projects in section 2 of this 25act shall be made from the highway fund.

267 Powers of Governor and Council. The governor and council are hereby authorized and 27empowered:

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I. To cooperate with and enter into such agreements with the federal government, or any 29agency thereof, as they may deem advisable, to secure federal funds for the purposes hereof.

30 II. To accept any federal funds which are, or become available for any project under sections 311 and 2 beyond the estimated amounts. The net appropriation of state funds for any project for 32which such additional federal funds are accepted shall be reduced by the amount of such additional 33 funds, and the amount of bonding authorized by section 5 shall be reduced by the same amount.

The amount of bonding authorized by section 5 shall be reduced by the 10amount that the appropriation of state funds is reduced pursuant to this section.
