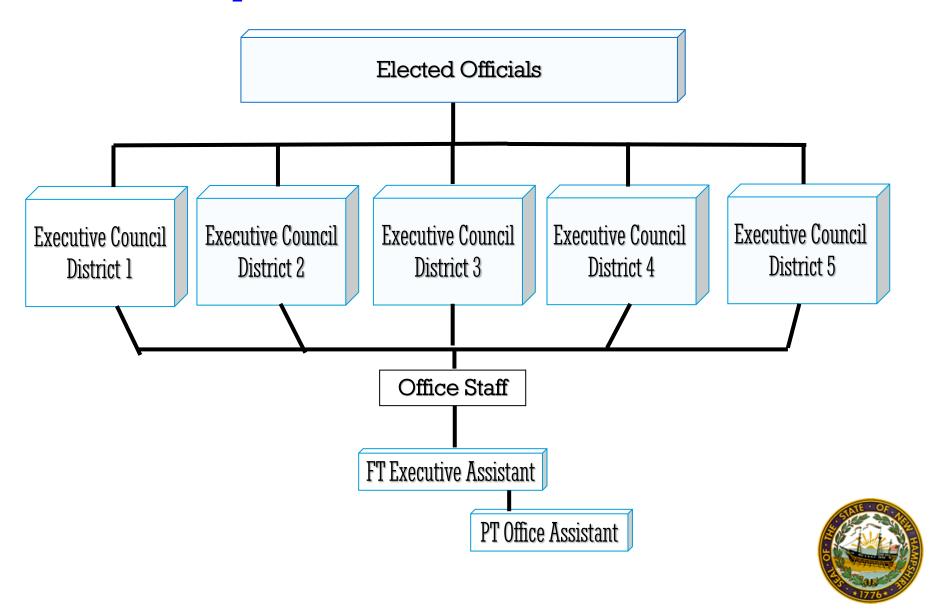

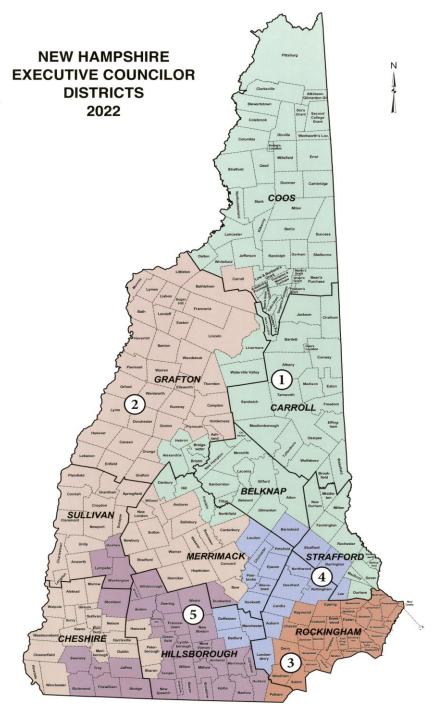

# NH Executive Council Mission Statement

... to ensure public access to the Executive Councilors, provide exceptional constituent service, and administratively support the Executive Councilors in their responsibilities to the Citizens of New Hampshire.





## Executive Council District 1:

91 Towns, Cities and Incorporated places; throughout 6 Counties; covering 3,639 sq.mi.

#### **Executive Council District 2:**

81 Towns and Cities; throughout6 Counties; covering3,081 sq.mi

## **Executive Council District 3:**

32 Towns and Cities; throughout 2 Counties; covering 518 sq.mi

## **Executive Council District 4:**

20 Towns and Cities; throughout5 Counties; covering674 sq.mi

#### **Executive Council District 5:**

35 Towns and Cities; throughout 4 Counties; covering 1,057 sq.mi



## NH Executive Council Core Functions

- Authorizes expenditures of the Executive Branch (in the amount of \$10,000.00 or more)
- Authorizes Justice of the Peace and Notary applications
- Confirms appointments to over 300 State boards and commissions including heads of State agencies, Judicial and Public Utilities nominees
- Conducts Public Hearings on Judicial and Public Utilities
   Commission nominees (Agency Heads at the discretion of the Council)
- Participates in public hearings, and information gathering to put together the 10 Year Highway Plan as members of the Governor's Advisory Commission on Intermodal Transportation (GACIT)



# NH Executive Council Budget Highlights

- Met the Governors Office FY24-FY25 Budget Target
- Prioritized needs are as follows:
  - Includes request to increase funding for Executive Council Stipends, which have not been increased since FY2010
  - Includes request to increase funding for Part Time Office Assistant position to allow for Office Coverage and proper assistance in the challenging recruitment environment we face today
  - Includes increases for DoIT as based on their recommendations to maintain the office technology/equipment and cost increases to the agency itself

    - 2,669 (approximate) contracts were reviewed and approved
    - □ 322 confirmations were approved to serve on boards and commissions
    - ☐ The Executive Council approves the spending of a major portion of the approximately 6.5 billion dollars appropriated annually by the legislature.
- 2021 Council GACIT work was approved by the Governor and Legislature in 2022 directing hundreds of millions of dollars to prioritized infrastructure projects.
