STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

In the Year of Our Lord Two Thousand Twenty Three

AN ACT prohibiting provocation based on the defendant's religion, race, creed, sexual orientation, national origin, political beliefs or affiliation, sex, or gender identity.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 1 Homicide; Manslaughter. Amend the introductory paragraph in RSA 630:2, I to read as 2 follows:

I. A person is guilty of manslaughter when [he] such person causes the death of another:

4 2 New Paragraph; Homicide; Manslaughter; Certain Provocation Not Objectively Reasonable.

- 5 Amend RSA 630:2 by inserting after paragraph III the following new paragraph:
- 6 IV. For the purpose of determining if the defendant was under the influence of extreme 7 mental or emotional disturbance caused by extreme provocation pursuant to paragraph I, the 8 provocation was not objectively reasonable if it resulted from the defendant's hostility to the 9 decedent's religion, race, creed, sexual orientation as defined in RSA 21:49, national origin, political 10 beliefs or affiliation, sex, or gender identity as defined in RSA 21:54.

11 3 Effective Date. This act shall take effect January 1, 2024.
