STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

In the Year of Our Lord Two Thousand Twenty Three

A RESOLUTION calling for the federal government to enact an American Marshall Plan to rebuild economically impoverished communities and strengthen climate resilience infrastructure.

1 Whereas, European towns, cities, and countries sustained unprecedented infrastructure damage $\mathbf{2}$ as a consequence of the Second World War from bombing and combat; and 3 Whereas, President Harry Truman feared that post-war Europe could be susceptible to 4authoritarianism and radicalism if war-torn countries were not rebuilt; and Whereas, The Marshall Plan, officially titled The European Recovery Program, sought to rebuild $\mathbf{5}$ 6 Europe following the Second World War; and 7 Whereas, The Marshall Plan was so successful that by 1952, every participant nation had 8 economies that were stronger than their pre-war economies; and 9 Whereas, many communities across the United States suffer similar infrastructure and economic 10 conditions as post-war Europe; and 11 Whereas, American deindustrialization has left many communities economically hollowed and 12devastated; and 13Whereas, climate change continues to ravage communities across the United States, engulfing 14entire towns in flames in the west, and flooding others in the east; and 15Whereas, the actions of individual Americans will not be able to reduce the larger structural 16impacts of economic stagnation and climate catastrophe; and 17Whereas, further ignoring of these issues could lead to the kind of totalitarianism that Secretary 18Marshall and President Truman feared; now, therefore, be it 19Resolved by the House of Representatives: 20That the New Hampshire house of representatives requests the federal government establish an 21American Marshall plan to rebuild, fortify, and secure American communities who have felt the 22negative economic impacts of deindustrialization and climate change; and 23That copies of this resolution be forwarded by the house clerk to the President of the United 24States, the President of the United States Senate, the Speaker of the United States House of 25Representatives, and to each member of the New Hampshire congressional delegation
