Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

- 1 1 New Paragraph; Breaches of the Peace; Violation of Privacy. Amend RSA 644:9 by inserting 2 after paragraph V the following new paragraph:
- 3 VI. Any person who is convicted of a second or subsequent offense under paragraphs I-III-a
- 4 of this section shall be guilty of a class B felony.
- 5 2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect January 1, 2024.
