New Paragraph; Public School Human Rights Complaints. Amend RSA 354-A:28 by inserting
after paragraph I the following new paragraph:

3 I-a. The department of education may file a complaint on the behalf of person aggrieved by a

4 discriminatory practice by a school or school district. RSA 354-A:19 shall apply to any retaliation or

5 discrimination against any person on whose behalf a complaint has been filed by the department.

6 2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect January 1, 2024.
