6	Amend the bill by replacing all after section 6 with the following:
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8	7 Emergency Medical and Trauma Services; Critical Incident Intervention and Management.
9	Amend RSA 153-A:17-a, I(e) - III(b) to read as follows:
10	(e) "Critical incident stress management team" or "team" means the group of one or
11	more trained volunteers, including members of peer support groups organized by a unit of state,
12	local, [or] county government, or employee organization who offer critical incident stress
13	management, [and] crisis intervention or peer support services following a critical incident or long
14	term or continued, debilitating stress being experienced by emergency services providers and
15	affecting them or their family situation.
16	(f) (1) "Peer Support Group" means the group of one or more trained volunteers,
17	organized by a unit of state, local, county government or employee organization that can
18	recognize common behavioral health issues, provide support services, and serve as a bridge
19	to community resources or behavioral health treatment when indicated.
20	[(f)(1)] (2) "Critical incident stress management team member" or "team member"
21	means an emergency services provider, including any law enforcement officer, sheriff or deputy
22	sheriff, state police officer, civilian law enforcement employee, firefighter, civilian fire department
23	employee, emergency medical personnel, telecommunicators, and local dispatchers specially trained
24	to provide critical incident stress management, [and] crisis intervention or peer support services as
25	a member of an organized and registered team.
26	[(2)] (3) In this subparagraph:
27	(A) "Telecommunicator" means an employee of the department of safety, division
28	of emergency services and communications who is responsible for receiving at the public safety
29	answering point telephone calls made to E911 and transferring or relaying such calls to public or
30	private safety agencies.
31	(B) "Local dispatcher" means a person who determines the location, status, and
32	assistance required by callers and walk-in customers for public safety services and dispatches the

1 appropriate police, fire, ambulance, or other units to provide needed emergency services at the state, $\mathbf{2}$ city, town, or private emergency services level.

3 II.(a) Team members shall undergo and sustain certification standards set forth in 4 guidelines established by the International Critical Incident Stress Foundation (ICISF) approved by the commissioner of the department of safety, or a similar organization for which the commissioner $\mathbf{5}$ 6 shall not unreasonably withhold approval. The team shall be registered with ICISF, or a similar 7organization, and maintain training standards to date as required.

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(b) All critical incident stress management team members or peer support group 9 *members*, sworn or civilian, shall be designated by the police chief, sheriff, director of the division of 10state police, fire chief, or director of the division of emergency services and communications, or head

of an employee organization. 11

12III.(a) Any information divulged to the team, [or a] team member or peer support group 13member, during the provision of critical incident stress management, [and] crisis intervention or 14*peer support* services shall be kept confidential and shall not be disclosed to a third party or in a criminal, civil, or administrative proceeding. Records kept by critical incident stress management 1516team members or peer support group are not subject to subpoena, discovery, or introduction into 17evidence in a criminal, civil, or administrative action. Except as provided in subparagraph (c), no 18person, whether critical incident stress management team member, [or] team leader or peer 19support group member providing or receiving critical incident stress management, [and] crisis 20intervention or peer support services, shall be required to testify or divulge any information 21obtained solely through such crisis intervention.

22(b) The purpose of this section is to provide a consistent framework for the operation of 23critical incident stress management teams, peer support groups, and their members. In any civil 24action against any individual, agency, or government entity, including the state of New Hampshire, 25arising out of the conduct of a member of such team, this section is not intended and shall not be 26admissible to establish negligence in any instance where requirements herein are higher than the 27standard of care that would otherwise have been applicable in such action under state law.

This bill:
