- HB 226's Section 1 adds a five-year extension to the repeal date of the produce inspection program under RSA 426-A from June 30, 2021 to June 30, 2026. This change was requested by the NH Department of Agriculture, Markets, and Food (DAMF). The produce inspection program is required under the federal Food Safety Modernization Act enacted by the US Department of Agriculture (USDA).
- HB 226's Section 2 creates a new section in RSA 426-A to give the DAMF Commissioner or his agent the ability to issue a "stop sale order" if produce is being sold in violation of produce safety rules under RSA 426-A. Section 2's language closely mirrors DAMF's current statutory authority under RSA 426:7-a on standards for farm products.
