Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

New Subparagraph Implementation of Drug Courts;Vocational Education Programs. Amend
RSA 490-G:2, I by inserting after subparagraph (b) the following new subparagraph:

3 (c) In addition to the programming under subparagraphs (a) and (b), a drug court may, 4 as a condition for completion of sentence, order a drug offender to a complete a program offering vocational or technical education courses. The drug court may order such education courses as a $\mathbf{5}$ 6 component of a pre-adjudication, post-adjudication, or a combination program. A county operating a 7drug court that offers vocational or technical educational courses offered pursuant to this 8 subparagraph shall be eligible to receive funding for such courses from the statewide drug offender 9 grant program pursuant to RSA 490-G:4. 10 2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.
