HOUSE BILL **202**

AN ACT relative to school lunch payment policies.

COMMITTEE: Education

ANALYSIS

This bill requires school boards that provide free or reduced cost meals to refrain from certain actions that could stigmatize a child who requests such a meal.

AN ACT relative to school lunch payment policies.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 1 New Paragraphs; Free and Reduced Cost Meals; Anti-Stigmatization Practices. Amend RSA
2 189:11-a by inserting after paragraph VIII the following new paragraphs:

3 IX. Each school board that makes meals available at no cost or at a reduced cost shall:

4 (a) Prohibit public identification or stigmatization of a student who cannot pay for a
5 meal or who owes a meal debt.

6 (b) Prohibit a child who cannot pay for a meal or who owes a meal debt from doing
7 chores or other work to pay for meals, unless chores or other work are required of all students.

8 (c) Require a school to direct communications about a child's meal debt to a parent or
9 guardian and not the student. Nothing in this section shall prohibit a school from sending a student
10 home with a letter addressed to a parent or guardian, provided that the letter shall not be
11 distributed to the child in a manner that stigmatizes the child.

12 X. Any school that participates in the National School Breakfast Program or the National
13 School Lunch Program shall not provide to any child who qualifies for a free or reduced price
14 breakfast or lunch an alternate meal that is not provided to students generally.

15 2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.
