Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 1 New Section; Observances Proclaimed by the Governor; Commemoration of the First Labor 2 Strike By Women in the United States Recognition Day. Amend RSA 4 by inserting after section 3 4:13-cc the following new section: The Dover Mill Girls Recognition Day. The governor shall annually issue a 4 4:13-dd 5 proclamation calling for a proper observance of December 30 in recognition of the first all-women 6 labor strike in the state of New Hampshire, which took place over 3 days in Dover, starting 7 December 26, 1828. This was a seminal event in United States history for both labor and women's 8 rights movements. Schools and libraries are encouraged to commemorate the day with appropriate 9 ceremonies and activities as close to the date as possible.

2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
