# Amendment to HB 187

1	Amend the title of the bill by replacing it with the following:
2	
$3 \\ 4 \\ 5 \\ 6$	AN ACT relative to the emergency powers of the commissioner of health and human services and relative to the membership of the oversight committee on health and human services.
7	Amend RSA 21-P:53, VIII as inserted by section 1 of the bill by replacing it with the following:
8	
9	VIII. Except as provided in paragraph IX, an emergency order issued under this
10	section shall be subject to review by the joint legislative oversight committee on health and
11	human services, established in RSA 126-A:13, and may be rescinded by a 2/3 vote of that
12	committee. The commissioner shall notify the ethics oversight advisory committee
13	established in RSA 141-C:27 of any emergency order issued under this section, and the joint
14	legislative oversight committee shall consider the input of the ethics committee, if
15	provided, in any decision. If the emergency precludes either committee from meeting in
16	person, they shall be authorized, notwithstanding any other provision of law, to meet
17	remotely for this purpose.

19	Amend RSA 21-P:53 as inserted by section 1 of the bill by inserting after paragraph VIII the
20	following new paragraph:

22	IX. An emergency order issued under paragraph V or VI shall be subject to
23	legislative oversight by the ethics oversight advisory committee pursuant to RSA 141-C:27,
24	II(b).

26	Amend the bill by replacing all after section 1 with the following:
27	
28	2 Communicable Disease; Ethics Committee. Amend RSA 141-C:27 to read as follows:
29	141-C:27 Ethics <i>Oversight Advisory</i> Committee.
30	I. There is hereby established an ethics <i>oversight advisory</i> committee to offer advice to the
31	commissioner relative to the ethical issues that may be identified in the course of planning for, and
32	responding to, outbreaks of communicable disease that threaten to become epidemic or pandemic

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1 and to review and provide recommendations for investigations, orders, and treatment 2 ordered by the commissioner.

3 II. The committee shall:

4 (a) Consider the ethical implications of any of the powers that may be exercised by the 5 commissioner under the provisions of this chapter including, but not limited to, the confiscation, 6 distribution, and rationing of anti-toxins, serums, vaccines, immunizing agents, antibiotics, and 7 other pharmaceutical agents, and mechanical equipment; the issuance and enforcement of orders of 8 isolation, quarantine, medical examination, and medical treatment; issues relative to information 9 sharing and confidentiality; and the provisions for due process for orders issued pursuant to this 10 chapter.

11 (b) Review, at least annually, a report of investigations conducted pursuant to 12 RSA 141-C:9 and orders issued under RSA 21-P:53, V and VI, and provide recommendations 13 to the department. Any information furnished to the committee shall be aggregated and 14 de-identified. The department shall not share any confidential information with the 15 committee.

16 (c) Consider the competing rights of disabled persons who might be unable to 17 comply with certain orders, health care workers who are entitled to a safe workplace, and 18 the need to protect the public from communicable disease, and may recommend 19 modification of orders to address specific concerns.

- (d) Consider both the need to protect the most vulnerable members of society as
  well as the need for the most efficacious means to control a public health emergency when
  consulting with the commissioner pursuant to RSA 21-P:53, III-b in developing a plan for
  the distribution of a new treatment or vaccination.

(a) Two members of the house or representatives, one of whom shall be from the
 minority party, appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives.

(b) One member of the senate, appointed by the senate president.

(c) The director of the *department of health and human services*, division of public

31 [(e)] (e) The attorney general, or designee.

32 [(d)] (f) A representative of a public health network, appointed by the commissioner.

33 [(e)] (g) A representative from a college or university public health program, appointed
 34 by the commissioner.

35 [(f) A chief of police or a police of a local police department, appointed by the New

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1	(g) A chief of a local fire department, appointed by the New Hampshire Association

6	(j) [A member of a fire department with a minimum of EMT-B certification, appointed by
7	the Professional Firefighters of New Hampshire.
8	(k)] A representative of a hospital, appointed by the New Hampshire Hospital

10	[(1) A county representative, appointed by the New Hampshire Association of Counties.]
11	(k) A representative of the Disability Rights Center of New Hampshire,
12	appointed by the center.
13	(l) The commissioner of the department of labor, or designee.
14	IV. [The commissioner shall appoint a member of the committee to act as chairperson.] The
15	committee shall elect one of the legislative members as chairperson. Legislative members
16	of the committee shall receive mileage at the legislative rate when attending to the duties

33	the health, human services and elderly affairs committee, and one of whom shall be from the house

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#### AMENDED ANALYSIS

This bill makes various changes to the powers of the commissioner of the department of health and human services during a public health emergency; authorizes the joint legislative oversight committee on health and human services to review, and rescind by a 2/3 vote, emergency orders issued by the commissioner; gives a person subject to a treatment order for a communicable disease a right to a hearing on the order; and amends the membership and duties of the ethics oversight advisory committee. The bill also amends the house membership on the health and human services oversight committee.
