## Floor Amendment to HB 611-FN

1	Amend the title of the bill by replacing it with the following:
$\frac{2}{3}$	AN ACT relative to eligibility criteria for the therapeutic cannabis program and establishing a
4 5	commission to study state-controlled sales of cannabis.
6	Amend the bill by replacing all after section 2 with the following:
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8	3 New Section; Commission to Study State-Controlled Sales of Cannabis. Amend RSA 176 by
9	inserting after section 16-a the following new section:
10	176:16-b Commission to Study State-Controlled Sales of Cannabis.
11	I. There is hereby established a commission to study state-controlled sales of cannabis and
12	cannabis products.
13	II. The members of the commission shall be as follows:
14	(a) Five members of the senate, appointed by the senate president.
15	(b) Five members of the house of representatives, appointed by the speaker of the house.
16	(c) The attorney general, or designee.
17	(d) The governor, or designee.
18	(e) A representative of the New Hampshire Association of Chiefs of Police, chosen by
19	that organization.
20	(f) A representative of the New Hampshire Bankers Association, chosen by that
21	organization.
22	(g) The chairman of the New Hampshire liquor commission, or designee.
23	(h) A representative of the New Hampshire Cannabis Association, chosen by that
24	organization.
25	(i) A representative of the American Civil Liberties Union- New Hampshire, chosen by
26	that organization.
27	(j) A representative of Alternative Treatment Centers, appointed by the speaker of the
28	house.
29	(k) A medical professional, appointed by the senate president.
30	(l) A representative of Communities for Alcohol and Drug-free Youth, chosen by that
31	organization.

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1	III. Legislative members of the commission shall receive mileage at the legislative rate while
2	attending to the duties of the commission.
3	IV. The commission shall study the feasibility of establishing a state-controlled system to
4	sell marijuana to adults 21 years and older that also:
<b>5</b>	(a) Allows the state to control distribution and access;
6	(b) Keeps marijuana away from kids and out of schools;
7	(c) Controls the marketing and messaging of the sale of marijuana;
8	(d) Prohibits "marijuana miles" or the over-saturation of marijuana retail
9	establishments;
10	(e) Empowers municipalities to choose to limit or prohibit marijuana retail
11	establishments;
12	(f) Reduces instances of multi-drug use; and
13	(g) Does not impose an additional tax so as to remain competitive.
14	V. The members of the commission shall elect a chairperson from among the members. The
15	first meeting of the committee shall be called by the first-named senate member. The first meeting
16	of the committee shall be held within 45 days of the effective date of this section. Ten members of
17	the committee shall constitute a quorum.
18	VI. The commission shall issue a final report of its findings and any recommendations for
19	proposed legislation to the president of the senate, the speaker of the house of representatives, the
20	senate clerk, the house clerk, the governor, and the state library. The report shall be submitted on
21	or before December 1, 2023.
22	VII. The commission shall be administratively attached to the department of justice.
23	4 Repeal. RSA 126-X: 13, relative to a commission to study state-controlled sales of cannabis, is
24	repealed.
25	5 Effective Date.
26	I. Sections 1-2 of this act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.
27	II. Section 4 of this act shall take effect December 1, 2023.
28	III. The remainder of this act shall take effect upon its passage.

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## AMENDED ANALYSIS

This bill:

I. Removes the requirement that severe pain be resistant to other treatment options in order to be considered a qualifying medical condition for therapeutic cannabis.

II. Establishes a commission to study state-controlled sales of cannabis.
