HOUSE BILL 623-FN

AN ACT establishing a teacher candidate loan forgiveness program.

COMMITTEE: Education

ANALYSIS

This bill establishes a teacher candidate loan forgiveness program administered by the university system for new teachers in critical teacher shortage areas of the state.

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

In the Year of Our Lord Two Thousand Twenty Three

AN ACT establishing a teacher candidate loan forgiveness program.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

- 1 1 New Section; Teacher Candidate Loan Forgiveness Program. Amend RSA 187-A by inserting 2 after section 24 the following new section: 3 187-A:24-a Teacher Candidate Loan Forgiveness Program. 4 I. There is established a teacher candidate loan forgiveness program to be administered by the university system of New Hampshire. 5 6 (a) An individual is eligible for a loan under this section to be used for financing the 7 individual's cost of attendance at an institution in the university system if the individual: 8 (1) Is a lawful resident of the state of New Hampshire; 9 (2) Has successfully completed his or her sophomore year at an institution of the 10 university system; 11 (3) Is enrolled in good standing at an institution of the university system as a full-12 time junior or senior, as determined by the institution; 13 (4) Is majoring in a degree program that will lead to the individual's becoming 14 eligible for licensure as a teacher in a high needs subject area as identified by the department of 15 education; and 16 (5) Has entered into a written agreement with the university system to: 17 (A) Teach for at least 5 consecutive years in a school or school district located in 18 a geographic area identified by the department of education as a critical teacher shortage area 19 beginning immediately upon obtaining licensure; and 20 (B) Repay each loan at an interest rate and on a schedule as determined by the 21 university system if the individual fails to meet the requirements under this section. 22 (b) If the amount of funds available for the teacher candidate loan forgiveness program 23 is insufficient to award loans to all qualified applicants under this section, the university system 24shall award the loans on a competitive basis.
 - II. Amount of Loan.

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- (a) The loan amounts under this section shall be \$5,000 per academic year. The total amount of loans awarded to an individual under this section shall not exceed \$10,000.
- (b) A loan made to an individual under this section shall be for one academic year, and renewable annually until the individual graduates from the institution of the university system and receives a degree, if the individual:
 - (1) Continues to meet the eligibility requirements under this section, and

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(2) Meets the satisfactory academic progress standards required to receive other
financial aid at the institution where the individual is enrolled, as determined by the institution of
the university system.
III. Loan Contract and Forgiveness.
(a) An individual who receives a loan under this section shall execute a written loan
contract with the university system for the repayment of the loan as provided in this section.
(b) A loan contract executed under subparagraph (a) shall provide that the total amount
of the loans awarded to the individual under this section, plus accrued interest, shall be forgiven at
the rate of 20 percent per year for each year that the individual teaches in a school or school district
located in a geographic area identified by the department of education as a critical teacher shortage
area.
IV. Repayment and Deferment.
(a) An individual who receives a loan under this section shall immediately begin
repayment of each loan the individual received, together with interest as determined by the
university system, if the individual:
(1) Ceases to be enrolled in good standing at an institution of higher education in
this state, unless the individual has graduated and received a degree;
(2) Does not obtain certification as a teacher from the state board of education
within one year of graduating and receiving a degree;
(3) Does not begin work as a certified teacher in the academic year immediately
following becoming certified;
(4) Does not teach in a school or school district located in a geographic area
identified by the department of education as a critical teacher shortage area in the individual's first
year as a licensed teacher; or
(5)(A) Does not teach in a school or school district located in a geographic area
identified by the department of education as a critical teacher shortage area for 5 consecutive years
beginning immediately upon obtaining certification.
(B) The total amount of the loans awarded to an individual that are subject to
repayment under subparagraph (5)(A) shall be reduced on a pro rata basis.
(b)(1) The university system may defer the requirements under subparagraphs (a)(3)-(5)
if the university system, in consultation with the department of education, determines that there
was no employment position available that would reasonably enable the individual to meet the
requirements.
(2) After the period of deferral, the individual shall begin or resume teaching in a
school or school district located in a geographic area identified by the department of education as a
critical teacher shortage area or become subject to repayment under subparagraph (a).

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- V. The university system of New Hampshire shall adopt rules pursuant to RSA 541A to implement this section. The department of education shall adopt rules pursuant to RSA 541-A which identify schools or school districts located in a geographic area as a critical teacher shortage area.
 - 2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect July 1, 2023.
