SENATE BILL ***106-FN***

AN ACT establishing an emerging professional certificate for child care programs.

SPONSORS: Sen. Fenton, Dist 10; Sen. Ward, Dist 8

COMMITTEE: Executive Departments and Administration

ANALYSIS

This bill creates emerging professional certificates and the requirements for the department of health and human services to issue such certificates.

AN ACT establishing an emerging professional certificate for child care programs.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 1 New Subparagraph; Child Day Care Licensing; Rulemaking. Amend RSA 170-E:11, I by
2 inserting after subparagraph (n) the following new subparagraph:

3 (o) Emerging Professional Certificates. An emerging professional certificate shall be
4 issued to an applicant who has graduated high school, completed an application to the department's
5 child care licensing unit, and completed the following requirements: completion of 500 hours in a
6 career technical education (CTE) program that includes a minimum of 200 hours of observation,
7 lesson planning, and practice teaching under supervision of a licensed educator in a licensed center-
8 based child care program, licensed family child care, public or private school pre-K through 3rd
9 grade program; 3 courses on educator preparation and child development; and submission of a plan
10 for on-going professional development.

11 2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
