Pursuant to RSA 14:30-a VI, authorize the Department of Justice (DOJ) to amend Fiscal Item 21-168, approved by the Fiscal Committee of the General Court on June 18, 2021, and item #173, approved by the Governor and Executive Council on June 30, 2021, by transferring funds in the amount of \$75,000 between classes from the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARPA) State Fiscal Recovery Funds (SFRF) for the purpose of accounting for administrative costs upon approval of the Fiscal Committee of the General Court and Governor and Executive Council through June 30, 2023. No additional funds are requested for this item. 100% Federal Funds.

EXPLANATION

The Department of Justice obtained approval to receive funds from the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) to subgrant funds to state agencies and municipalities to manage activities related to COVID-19 restrictions; an allowable use of ARP FRF funds under Section 602 (c)(1) (C) for maintenance and building of critical state infrastructure necessary for government services.

DOJ is requesting to transfer funds from class 072, Grants Federal, to class 029, Transfers Within An Agency, to properly account for the cost of administering and monitoring the fund through June 30, 2023.

In the event that federal funds become no longer available, general funds will not be requested to support this program.

Per the Budget Officer's instructional memorandum dated April 17, 1985, the required information is provided below:

- 1. *Justification*: The transfer from class 029 to 072 will allow the Department of Justice to properly account for the cost of administering and monitoring the fund.
- 2. Does this transfer involve continuing programs or one-time projects? This is a technical correction to move funds from class 072 to class 029 to cover administrative costs.
- 3. Is this transfer required to maintain existing program levels or will it increase the program level? This transfer will cover the costs of administering, reviewing, and monitoring subgrant disbursements.

EXPLANATION

The Department of Justice is requesting to accept and expend funds from the Federal American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARPA), State Fiscal Recovery Funds (SFRF) for the purpose of subgranting those funds to state agencies and municipalities to manage activities related to relaxed COVID-19 restrictions.

Federal award funds, for this item, are budgeted to support grant activities as follows:

072-509073-Grants to municipalities and payment for administration of the grant. 085-5885XX-Grants to state agencies.

Due to relaxed COVID-19 rules and restrictions and increased post-pandemic demand for travel, hospitality, tourism, and other services, it is expected that the State will see a heavy influx of resident and tourist activity. Although this is a very welcome change, it also poses a challenge to state agencies and municipalities in managing large groups of people and dealing with increases in tourist and other activities that may lead to unrest or other security challenges. Subgrants may include, but not be limited to, paying for safety items, funding overtime for local police departments, and increasing personnel resources. This is an allowable use of ARP FRF funds under Section 602 (c)(1) (C) for maintenance and building of critical state infrastructure necessary for government services.

In the event that Federal Funds become no longer available, General Funds will not be requested to support this program.
