REQUESTED ACTION

Pursuant to RSA 14:30-a, VI, authorize the New Hampshire Fish and Game Department (NHFGD), to **Retroactively** amend Fiscal Committee item #21-343, approved November 19, 2021, and Governor and Council item #64, approved November 22, 2021, by extending the end date from April 1, 2023 to June 30, 2024 and to accept and expend \$50,732 of American Rescue Plan (ARPA) State Fiscal Recovery Funds (SFRF) from the Department of Environmental Services (DES) for the purpose of continuing to fund a feasibility study to evaluate improvements and upgrades at the state fish hatcheries, effective upon Fiscal Committee and Governor and Council approval through June 30, 2024. **Funding Source: 100% Federal Fund Transfer from Other Agency.**

EXPLANATION

This item is **Retroactive** due to the timing of the expiration of the MOA between the Department of Environmental Services (NHDES) and NHFGD, which was April 1, 2023, to utilize these funds for the stated purpose. A retroactive amendment for NHDES to continue utilizing these ARPA funds required Fiscal Committee and Governor and Council approval. This step was a necessary precursor to amending the expiration and use of remaining funds in the MOA between NHFGD and NHDES.

Pursuant to the provisions of RSA 124:15, and contingent upon approval of Requested Action #1, authorize the New Hampshire Fish and Game Department (NHFGD) to create class 046, Consultants, for the purpose of hiring an outside consultant to conduct a feasibility study at the Department's Powder Mill Fish Hatchery, effective upon Fiscal Committee and Governor and Council approval through April 1, 2023. Funding Source: 100% Federal Fund Transfer from Other Agency.
