9	166 Classrooms for Kids Grants. RSA 198:15-b is repealed and reenacted to read as follows:
10	198:15-b Classrooms for Kids Grants.
11	I. In addition to any other education aid program, each year the commissioner of the
12	department of education shall calculate a classrooms for kids grant for schools and provide that
13	amount of aid to a municipality's school districts as follows:
14	(a) \$300 for each pupil in the municipality's ADMR in grades kindergarten through
15	grade 8.
16	(b) \$350 for each pupil in the municipality's ADMR in grades 9 through grade 12.
17	II. In addition to any other education aid program, each year the commissioner shall
18	calculate a classrooms for kids grant for chartered public schools, except for the Virtual Learning
19	Academy Charter School, as follows:
20	(a) \$300 for each pupil in the chartered public school's ADMA in grades kindergarten
21	through grade 8.
22	(b) \$350 for each pupil in the chartered public school's ADMA in grades 9 through grade
23	12.
24	III. Grants under this section shall be used for capital expenditures, including, but not
25	limited to the construction of new buildings, additions, major renovations, major repairs, leased
26	space, temporary classrooms, or adding to capital reserves. This shall not include general
27	maintenance costs such as routine repairs, landscaping, or winter maintenance.
28	IV. Grants under this section shall be distributed to school districts pursuant to the
29	payment schedule under RSA 198:42, and to chartered public schools pursuant to the payment
30	schedule under RSA 194-B:11, I(c)

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1 V. The amount necessary to fund the grants under this section is hereby appropriated to the $\mathbf{2}$ department from the education trust fund created under RSA 198:39. The governor is authorized to 3 draw a warrant from the education trust fund to satisfy the state's obligation under this section. 4 Such warrant for payment shall be issued regardless of the balance of funds available in the $\mathbf{5}$ education trust fund. If the balance in the education trust fund, after the issuance of any such 6 warrant, is less than zero, the comptroller shall transfer sufficient funds from the general fund to 7eliminate such deficit. The commissioner of the department of administrative services shall inform 8 the fiscal committee and the governor and council of such balance. This reporting shall not in any 9 way prohibit or delay the distribution of adequate education grants.

10 167 Minimum Appropriation for Biennium. The minimum amounts of \$50,000,000 in the fiscal 11 year ending June 30, 2024, and \$50,000,000 in the fiscal year ending June 30, 2025, are hereby 12 appropriated to the department of education for the disbursement of classrooms for kids grants 13 established under RSA 198:15-b. The governor is authorized to draw a warrant for said sum out of 14 any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated. This appropriation shall be a charge to the 15 education trust fund.

169 Education Trust Fund; Purposes. Amend the introductory paragraph of RSA 198:39, I to

23I. The state treasurer shall establish an education trust fund in the treasury. Moneys in such fund shall not be used for any purpose other than to distribute adequate education grants to 2425municipalities' school districts and to approved charter schools pursuant to RSA 198:42, to provide 26low and moderate income homeowners property tax relief under RSA 198:56-198:61, to distribute 27school building aid to school districts and approved chartered public schools for projects 28authorized prior to June 30, 2023 and for classrooms to kids grants pursuant to RSA 198:15-29b, to distribute tuition and transportation funds to school districts for students attending career and 30 technical education programs pursuant to RSA 188-E:9, to distribute special education aid to school 31districts pursuant to RSA 186-C:18, to fund department of education operating costs for a state 32student data collection and reporting system, and to fund kindergarten programs as may be 33 determined by the general court. 36 II. Upon completion, the constructed or renovated facility shall become the property of the 37 school district or public academy, for use by the career and technical education center exclusively.

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1 Provision of the site, parking, and other related areas shall be the responsibility of the local $\mathbf{2}$ community. Site work, including, but not limited to cut and fill work, compaction, demolition, 3 relocation of utilities, relocation of roadways and sidewalks, and similar work within an area 4extending to one foot beyond the outside edge of the exterior walls of the building, shall be eligible for grants under paragraph I. [Nothing shall prohibit the inclusion of the site and related facilities $\mathbf{5}$ 6 which are not funded as part of construction cost by the state under this chapter from being included $\mathbf{7}$ in a regular building aid grant application of the district as provided in RSA 198:15-b. However, no 8 school district which receives any funding under this chapter shall be eligible to receive school 9 building aid grants under RSA 198:15 b for the same project.] Maintenance, repair, and upkeep of 10the constructed or renovated facility, including all classroom and laboratory spaces, shall be the responsibility of the school district or public academy, as the case may be. 11
