- 1. The meeting was convened at 9:00 a.m. by Rep. McGuire as Chair.

Members present at this time, aside from Rep. McGuire, were Senators Lang, and Innis, and Representatives McGuire, Fellows, Grote, Hakken-Phillips, Layon, Lynn, and Schmidt.

Rep. McGuire designated Rep. Grote as an alternate for Rep. Hatch, who was absent, Rep. Fellows for Sen. Chandley, who was absent, and Rep. Hakken-Phillips for Sen. Whitley, who was absent.

2. The Committee discussed the minutes of the Committee meeting on March 17, 2023.

8. The Committee discussed Final Proposal 2022-230 from the Department of Health and Human Services (Rights of Persons Receiving Developmental Services or Acquired Brain Disorder Services).

11. The Committee discussed Proposed Interim Rule INT 2023-1 from the Department of Safety (Interim Carriage of Household Goods by Motor Vehicles). Aron Johnson testified for the Department of Safety.

Sen. Lang moved to conditionally approve the proposal, based on the Committee's determination that a paragraph be added to the rule stating that if a conflict arises between Saf-C 4600 and Saf-C 9100, then Saf-C 9100 takes precedent, and that Saf-C 9103.01(b)(3) be amended to clarify that "the carrier shall not

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charge the customer any amount which exceeds 10% of the original estimate without the customer's consent."

Rep. Schmidt seconded.

Adopted.
