#### 5. Short Title: Conformity

6. (a) Summary of what the rule says and of any proposed amendments:

Federal law (§176 of the Clean Air Act, as amended, and 40 CFR 93) require states to adopt rules to establish a consultative process relative to conformity determinations. Conformity applies to transportation plans, transportation improvement programs (TIPs), and projects funded or approved by the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) or the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) in areas that do not meet or previously have not met air quality standards for ozone, carbon monoxide, particulate matter, or nitrogen dioxide (known as "nonattainment areas" or "maintenance areas," respectively). Env-A 1500, *Conformity*, implements these federal requirements in New Hampshire to comply with the requirements and to ensure that the purpose and intent of the state implementation plan (SIP) are being met. The rules are scheduled to expire on October 1, 2019, so the Department is proposing to readopt the chapter with amendments in order to clarify and update various provisions. **The existing rules will continue in effect pursuant to RSA 541-A:14-a, I, subject to the conditions specified therein.** 

Specifically, the Department is proposing to readopt the rules with amendments to: (1) clarify the rules by amending certain definitions; (2) more clearly specify the federal agencies with which the Department must coordinate or consult; (3) update the CFR references and otherwise aligning the rules with current federal requirements; (4) clarify existing requirements relative to metropolitan planning organizations (MPOs); and (5) revise New Hampshire Department of Transportation (NHDOT) requirements related to travel demand modeling and project-level conformity determinations, the frequency of interagency consultation meetings and to the length of public comment periods relative to transportation conformity.

#### 6. (b) Brief description of the groups affected:

The federal conformity processes reflected by the proposed rules require participation by the Department, the NH Department of Transportation; various metropolitan planning organizations (MPOs), specifically the Southern New Hampshire MPO, the Nashua MPO, the Strafford MPO, and the Rockingham MPO; regional planning commissions having municipalities located in a nonattainment or maintenance area; the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency; the Federal Highway Administration; and the Federal Transit Administration. The processes also contemplate public participation, but no sector of the public is required to participate.

New Hampshire is required to adopt the proposed rules under 42 U.S.C. §7506; 23 CFR 450; 40 CFR 51, Subpart T and Subpart W; and 40 CFR 93, Subpart A. #### 5. Short Title: **Permit Application Forms**

6. (a) Summary of what the rule says and of any proposed amendments:

The existing rules, Env-A 1700, *Permit Application Forms*, establish the information and forms required to be submitted for air-related programs by applicants for a temporary permit, state permit to operate, or Title V operating permit. The rules are scheduled to expire on October 1, 2019, so the Department is proposing to readopt the chapter with amendments to incorporate the forms themselves by reference. Thus, the submission requirements currently set forth in narrative form in the rules would be contained almost entirely in the incorporated forms. In addition, submission requirements applicable to turbines and engines, currently addressed in Env-A 1704 (ARD-2 – Fuel Burning Devices) would be moved to Env-A 1709 (ARD-7 – Engines and Turbines) and Title V submission requirements currently in Env-A 1709 would be incorporated entirely in Env-A 1703 (ARD-1 – General Facility Information). Submission requirements currently applicable to hot mix asphalt plants under Env-A 1705 (ARD-3 – Processing or Manufacturing Equipment) would be addressed in Env-A 1710 (ARD-8 –Stationary Hot Mix Asphalt Plants). The existing rules will continue in effect pursuant to RSA 541-A:14-a, I, subject to the conditions specified therein.

#### 6. (b) Brief description of the groups affected:

The rules may impact any person who is required to obtain a temporary permit, state permit to operate, or Title V permit, because an application, as described in these rules, must be submitted to the Department. The types of facilities subject to this rule include fuel-burning devices, boilers, processing or manufacturing equipment that emits air pollutants, fuel and volatile organic liquid storage tanks, fuel loading facilities, incinerators, engines and turbines, and hot mix asphalt plants.

#### 5. Short Title: SO2 and NOx Annual Budget Trading and Banking Program

6. (a) Summary of what the rule says and of any proposed amendments:

The existing rules, Env-A 2900, were originally adopted after the enactment of RSA 125-O, the NH Clean Power Act, in 2002. The rules establish an annual budget trading and banking program for sulfur dioxide (SO2) and nitrogen oxides (NOx). Annual budgets and allowance allocation methodologies are established for these pollutants as specified in RSA 125-O:3. The rules include requirements for emissions monitoring, recordkeeping, reporting, and automatic deduction of allowances to offset excess emissions. The rules also include provisions regarding energy efficiency, new renewable energy, and conservation and land management allocations in accordance with RSA 125-O:5.

The rules are scheduled to expire on October 1, 2019, so the Department is proposing to readopt the chapter with amendments to update references to federal regulations. The existing rules will continue in effect pursuant to RSA 541-A:14-a, I, subject to the conditions specified therein.

#### 5. Short Title: Amendments to Adopted Wetlands Rules: Definitions, Content of Waiver Requests

6. (a) Summary of what the rule says and of any proposed amendments:

After a lengthy process, new wetlands rules in subtitle Env-Wt were adopted in June to be effective December 15, 2019. The Department is proposing amendments to the recently adopted, but not yet effective, definitions to (1) correct cross-references; (2) add definitions of "prime wetlands" and "designated prime wetlands" so the rules are clear that the protections afforded to prime wetlands only apply if they have been designated and revise the rules where the terms are used; (3) separate designated prime wetlands from duly-established 100-foot buffers in the definition of "priority resource area"; and (4) clarify the definitions of "significant environmental impact" and "water access structure". The Department also is proposing to amend the recently adopted, but not yet effective, Env Wt 204.03(c), relative to the content of waiver requests, to delete language that is potentially confusing.

6. (b) Brief description of the groups affected:

After a lengthy process, new rules in subtitle Env-Wt were adopted in June to be effective December 15, 2019. The Department is proposing amendments to the recently adopted, but not yet effective, rules to correct errors that were found subsequent to adoption and to clarify certain rules that have been determined to need clarification based on preparation of forms and training materials.

Amendments to Env-Wt 300 also would replace "the 2019 effective date of this chapter" with "December 15, 2019" and add procedures for processing routine roadway maintenance registrations (inadvertently omitted in prior process). Amendments are proposed to Env-Wt 406.01(d)(1)-(2) to update the name of the NHF&G vernal pool guidance and insert the date of the draft USACE vernal pool guidance, are proposed to Env-Wt 406.06(c) to correct the omission of minor projects, and are proposed to Env-Wt 407.07(c), Table Env-Wt 407-2, Classification Criteria For Specified Projects, to add four types of projects that were inadvertently omitted. In Env-Wt 500, provisions being clarified include those pertaining to timing of bank/shoreline stabilization projects, classification of non-docking structure projects, forestry project classifications, design requirements and classification of residential and commercial/industrial projects, and plans and construction requirements for certain dam-related projects. Env-Wt 602.15 is proposed to be revised to update the taxonomic names of certain species and to correct errors in others. #### **3.** Cost and benefits of the proposed rule(s):

The proposed rules governing mobile barbershops will allow individuals to engage in this specific activity under separate licensure and these individuals will pay the same existing fees applicable to non-mobile (regular) barbershops. The fee for an applicant applying for a mobile barbershop license is \$60, the fee for an applicant applying for a booth inside a mobile barbershop is \$50, the fee for renewal of a mobile barbershop license is \$100 for 2 years, and the fee for late renewal of a mobile barbershop license is \$55.

There is no requirement that a mobile barbershop licensee also obtain a regular license, and both licenses would only be required if the individual sought to engage in both mobile and regular licensed activities. RSA 313-A:25, VII and IX already provide exemptions for an individual with a regular shop license to provide services to individuals in nursing homes or for individuals with limited mobility in their own homes.

It is unknown how many individuals may pursue a mobile license and what additional revenue may be generated as result of this available licensed activity.
