Senate Republicans strengthen state's anti-discrimination law

CONCORD, NH – Majority Leader Jeb Bradley (R-Wolfeboro) issued the following statement today after the action by Senate Republicans on the Finance Committee to strengthen New Hampshire's anti-discrimination laws:

“The amendment we are placing in the budget makes it clear that discrimination has no place in New Hampshire workplaces or classrooms. Under the amendment, it would be discrimination to instruct or train public employees or educate New Hampshire students that one group of people is inherently superior or inferior to another or that a certain group of people is inherently racist by virtue of their immutable characteristics.”

“Under the amendment, educators have the academic freedom to teach the history of our state and country without interference and public employers can conduct bias training.”

“For those individuals who believe they are victims of discrimination in a school or public workplace setting, our amendment makes clear they may pursue a civil action against a school district or file a complaint with the state's Human Rights Commission.”
