Commerce Committee votes to advance Right-to-Work bill

SB61 puts focus on greater job growth and higher wages in NH

CONCORD, NH -- The Commerce Committee voted today to advance Right-to-Work legislation to the full Senate for a vote. Under SB61, employees would not be forced to join a labor union. Two of the bill's sponsors issued the following statements in support of the legislation:

Majority Leader Jeb Bradley (R- Wolfeboro) called the legislation pro-jobs and pro-worker saying SB61 would "create higher wages for New Hampshire workers which has been the case in other states that have adopted 'Right-to-Work laws. He added, "Allowing employees to choose whether to join a union or not ensures greater accountability for the union. If unions are effectively advocating for employees, they will naturally be inclined to join."

Sen. Harold French (R- Canterbury) said, "I have always believed that Right-To-Work laws are good for workers, good for business and overwhelmingly supported by Granite Staters."
