New law making modifications on Lucky 7 games will benefit charities

CONCORD, NH – A new law is giving one of New Hampshire’s most popular lottery games the option of going paperless and increases the size of the deal the state Lottery may authorize. The changes are a result of SB 22 being signed into law. The bill’s prime sponsor, Sen. Harold French (R-Canterbury) issued the following statement today:

“These changes make tremendous sense. Before SB 22, state law required electronic Lucky 7 machines to dispense paper tickets showing the results of each game. Now, paper will no longer be required. This will save the charities who benefit from Lucky 7 from spending thousands on paper and eliminate waste as well because most people simply end up throwing their tickets on the floor because the outcome of the game is displayed on the machine’s electronic screen. Additionally, deal sizes that were once held at 3,500 tickets can now go up to 14,000 which will allow charities to offer larger prizes that will attract more players.”
