Charity gaming rules clarified with bi-partisan Senate Bill

CONCORD, NH – Prime sponsor Sen. Bob Giuda (R-Warren) applauded SB27 being signed into law today and issued the following statement regarding the clarifications made to the state’s charitable gaming laws:

“Charitable gaming is extremely popular and profitable here in New Hampshire. Over the last few years, we realized that some of the rules governing these games needed clarification. Now that SB27 is law, all charity gaming licenses will expire on December 31, instead of being based on the date when a license was issued. The definition of what kind of charities qualify for games of chance, bingo and Lucky 7 licenses has also been expanded. Going forward, these commonsense measures will bring greater consistency across all types of charitable gaming as well as the licensing required to host an operation.”
