Senate votes to protect voter integrity with SB54

CONCORD, NH – The Senate today voted to pass SB54, legislation designed to protect the integrity of the absentee ballot process in New Hampshire.

The Chairman of the Election Law and Municipal Affairs Committee, Sen. Jim Gray (R-Rochester), called SB54 important saying, “It will protect the security of New Hampshire elections because it gives city and town clerks the ability to confirm the identity of all absentee voters. In the last election, many clerks were apprehensive in processing absentee ballots due to the large number that they received. SB54 allows for several pieces of information to be used for identification. This legislation protects the sacred privilege of voting and also creates equity between those voters who show up in person and are required to show an I.D and those who send their ballot in the mail.”
