Senate concurs with House on remedy for Windham voting discrepancies

CONCORD, NH – Sen. James Gray (R-Rochester), Chairman of the Election and Municipal Affairs Committee, today released the following statement on the Senate concurring with the House on SB 43, authorizing an audit of the ballot counting machines and hand tabulation of ballots in the District 7 state representatives race held as part of the general election in Windham on November 3, 2020:

“We are pleased that the Senate and the House have reached agreement on this important and timely piece of legislation. Ensuring the integrity of our election process is one of the most important responsibilities we have as legislators. SB43 creates the ability to audit the votes cast in the Windham state representative’s race, the results of which have been called into question. The audit will be conducted in public view as it should be so that every voter can be confident of the election process. We look forward to the governor signing the bill in to law.”
