Senate passes Capital Budget for FY22-FY23 *Funds critical infrastructure projects across the state*

Concord, NH – The Senate today passed a new \$346M Capital Budget (HB25-A) for the next two years. Sen. John Reagan, (R-Deerfield) Chairman of the Capital Budget Committee, issued the following statement regarding the bill’s passage:

“This budget invests in New Hampshire’s infrastructure without placing a burden on taxpayers, now or in the future. And, by leveraging \$25 million in additional federal funds, we are able to address even more projects and reduce future costs to New Hampshire taxpayers.”

“While HB25-A is sometimes the lesser known of the three big budget bills that we vote on every two years, its importance cannot be understated. The capital projects it funds touch the lives of all Granite Staters, including sewer and clean drinking water projects, plus critical repairs to sidewalks, parking lots, dams, ports and railways, just to name a few. The impact of these projects is felt both locally and state-wide, keeping New Hampshire competitive and its citizens safe.”
